

AGENDA PAPER - CLT 2021 NOMINATION

The Church Leadership Team (CLT) functions as the Church Board under the authority of the Church Constitution. It has both spiritual and business governance roles to ensure that the community of believers in GRLC move within the will of God; it provides policy and guidance for God's overall direction of the church and other spiritual matters, while upholding good management and stewardship of the church.

The Church Constitution allows the CLT to have ten members; consisting the Senior Pastor and partners voted in by the congregation for up to two 3-year term. CLT can appoint an additional CLT member out of session if required, but they must be confirmed at the next Congregational meeting.

The 2021 CLT members are:

Nomination

The CLT is proposing that the partners appoint a new member, Alison Dye. Alison is a mature Christian and active Chipping Norton site member. She serves as a Life Group Leader and has a strong pastoral heart. She will contribute to a balanced and diverse CLT that is well-placed to take the church into its future. Nomination Process

The nomination is made to the congregation after a process of several months of selection and discernment. Potential candidates are determined in consultation with the Staff Leadership Team (SLT) on a basis of their spiritual maturity and gifts, personal skills and fit into the CLT and calling. The shortlisted candidates are approached and both the CLT and the candidate take some time in prayer and

discernment before they both agree to the nomination and the normal recruitment checks are made. The nomination is endorsed by the CLT and SLT.

Although it rarely occurs, Partners may also nominate people outside of the CLT, and it would be expected that they would go through the same process.

You will be asked to complete a ballot form, which will be distributed on sign-in. You are asked to consider the candidate and their suitability as a CLT member. We ask that you consider this prayerfully.

Alison has been a Primary school teacher at William Carey Christian School since 1991 and in 2022 is reducing her hours to 2 days a week.
